Smith, who is a member of the Highland Historical Society, stated that the Historical Society would like to have a historical marker placed on the southeast corner of Milford and Livingston Roads. This marker will represent when the railroad went through, when the village was established and the history of the pickle factory. The Historical Society will most likely pay for half of the sign.

Perrin suggested that we know the costs that will be involved and how much the Historical Society will contribute.

It was also discussed the Oakland County Road Commission has to approve the sign.
